15-26 April

Online Programme Opening

Welcome and introduction to the Academy as well as to the theme of sustainable development.

23-24 May

Welcome to IDOS

Participants will be introduced and introduce themselves to the institute and IDOS colleagues.

27-31 May

Leadership I

Participants will disscuss different leadership models and theories. They will explore their values, attitudes, goals and visions for the future and systematically reflect on how their actions are determined by certain thought patterns.

3-25 June

Just Transition Management

This module introduces "Just Sustainability Transitions," a governance approach for societal sustainability transformation. Participants will learn tools to drive change in their communities, using Climate and Energy examples. Study trips to Brussels and Berlin will complement the content, focusing on the European and German context.

Participants will receive individual and peer-coaching; make knowledge and methods applicable in their home contexts and prepare for the next module.

2-20 September

Tackling Multidimensional Inequalities

Inequality impact all areas of life and is at the heart of today challenges. This module explores the complexity, multidimensionality and intersectional nature of inequalities and their linkage to power. It offers room to discuss key drivers, new pathways and potential policy solutions.

Participants will receive individual and peer-coaching; make knowledge and methods applicable in their home contexts and prepare for the next module.

14-18 October

Leadership II

Participants will reflect on their personal leadership journey and discuss what kind of leadership is needed to address today's complex challenges.

21 October – 1 November

Citizenship and Democracy

There is growing citizen frustration with governments and democracy. Such frustrations can lead citizens to anti-democratic governance models, hoping that they will bring change. This module explores pathways citizens can use to recapture and assert their sovereign role to make the democracy project work for all.

In-between

Participants will receive individual and peer-coaching; make knowledge and methods applicable in their home contexts and prepare for the next module.

18-22 November

Harvesting and Closing

During the closing, participants will harvest their learnings and continue reflections on how to implement these in their home countries.
